Get in the Act is celebrating its 19th summer of providing aspiring young performers with innovative and enriching performing arts training. Through their work, students can explore and express their individuality, build self-confidence, and gain new knowledge and expand their understanding of performing arts techniques. A final performance will be presented for family and friends on the last day of camp, on Friday. Memorization of a script is required. Each camp has a limited to 12 students to ensure individual attention.

Camp Broadway Structure: 3 hour camp

30 minutes: Physical and Vocal Warm-ups 60 minutes: Rehearsal for Theater Production

20 minutes: Break (provide your own snack and a water bottle)

40 minutes: Activities at this time vary day to day, they may include-

Stage Make-Up; Small Group Rehearsal; Art Project

15 minutes: Clean Up

15 minutes: Group Improvisation

Our Camp Theater Production for grades 3rd-7th will be "Ella Enchanted"

On the day of her birth, Ella is given a gift from her Fairy Godmother - the gift of obedience, which turns into a curse. Under no circumstances can Ella refuse *anything* she is asked to do, no matter how wicked it may be. Tired of being taken advantage of, Ella leaves home to find her Fairy Godmother and return her unwanted gift. This simple errand soon turns into an amazing journey filled with ogres, wicked stepsisters, elves and plotting of Prince Charmont's evil Uncle, who wants to take over the crown and rule the kingdom. Ella Enchanted is a heartwarming tale with a happy ending.

Our Camp Theater Production for grades K-3rd will be "Scooby Doo in Phantom Gulch"

There's a new sheriff in town - Scooby-Doo! Yee-Haw! Scooby and the gang from Mystery, Inc. are on vacation with their cousins in the wild, wild west. They're visiting an old-fashioned western theme town. But then some mysterious phantom cowboys start scaring all of the tourist away! Can the Mystery Inc. Gang lasso those creepy cowpokes before this theme town turns into a ghost town?

About Get in the Act! Programs:

Get in the Act programs and camps provide young people ages 3 to 17with innovative and enriching performing arts training. Through their work, students can explore and express their individuality, build self-confidence, and gain new knowledge and understanding of acting techniques.

Please discuss with your child that Camp Broadway's goal is to create a group of performers working together as a team, not individual recognition. It is the same concept as one would find in an organized team sport.

Auditioning on the first day of camp:

On the first day of camp, students will audition for parts in our play. After the auditions we ask each student performer what two parts they would like to play in our production. Please discuss with your child(ren) that they may not get the parts they requested.

One student performer may have two or three small roles differing from the actor who plays the main character. In the process the students work together to mount a theatrical performance that is fun, exciting and full of self-discovery.

What to expect from the audition:

Remember that the director is on your side. We will be looking for the student's best qualities. The director has gone through the audition process as an actor and understands how nerve wracking the process can be. So relax, have fun and do your best.

In the audition, students will:

- Participate in an improvisational exercise.
- Present of a short scene from the stories that we will be adapting.
- Present line readings from various characters of the play.

Students will be evaluated individually. Areas of assessment will include:

- Physical and Vocal Expression
- Text/Sub Text (what the character is thinking internally)
- Overall Impact
- Improvisation (ability to think and respond quickly to the situation)
- Ability to receive feedback/constructive criticism

• Ability to take direction and apply it to a scene.

What to Wear to and Bring to Camp:

Please be prepared to wear comfortable clothing and shoes suitable for movement/dance, i.e. sweats or dancewear; no skirts/dresses. Shoes should be tennis or dance shoes (ballet or jazz). No flip flops or shoes that can easily fall off.

Costumes

Costumes will be provided and will be minimal, i.e. character hat, tail, etc... Students should be prepared to wear their own clothes to create a character.

Water Bottle/Snack

Students are encouraged to bring water in a water bottle with a pop up top and a healthy snack. Due to student allergies, please no food with peanuts.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Students should arrive on time. Parents must walk their children to and from program. Programs start immediately at the scheduled times. Drop off students no earlier than 5 minutes prior to start of program; parents should wait with their children. Please enter the room at your scheduled program time. Please understand that our instructors have other teaching and family commitments after program is over for the day. Parents, please come inside to pick up your child. No student will be allowed to wait outside the building.

Student Behavior Expectations for Camp Broadway

Parents, please review the student behavior expectations with your child before camp begins.

Get in the Act 'Student Behavior Expectations' is designed to protect student rights and to inform students and parents of acceptable classroom behavior and the consequences of misconduct. All students enrolled in Get in the Act classes will be held responsible for the content and intent of this document.

Get in the Act staff will protect each individual student's right to:

- Learn in an environment free of violence.
- Learn in a classroom free of constant disruption.
- Learn in a non-threatening, safe, and caring environment.
- Participate in classes without prejudice or harassment of any kind.
- 1. Students will arrive at class on time, prepared and ready to learn each day. Students will be polite and respectful to teachers and staff. Students will cooperate and follow instructions. Students will conduct themselves with good manners, kindness towards others, and respect for all. Students have a responsibility to come prepared to class by working at home to have memorized lines, reviewed staging, songs and movement. During class time each student is responsible for assisting in set-up and strike. After a performance students are responsible for neatly placing costume and props in appropriate places.
- 2. Students will raise their hand to be recognized and may not inflict disruptive behavior on his or her classmates.
- 3. Students will work and learn cooperatively together and not hurt others.
- 4. **Students must use acceptable language**. Inappropriate language is not allowed at school.
- 5. Students will care appropriately for all costumes, props and set pieces. The rule of theater, if your character does not use the prop in a performance, you do not touch it.
- 6. Students must remain with a teacher or counselor at all times.
- 7. **Students will be honest and truthful in the classroom.** Stealing is not permitted and will result in dismissal from the program.
- 8. Students will be treated fairly, without prejudice, and with courtesy.
- 9. **Solving Problems** All students must learn to solve problems through appropriate means. In response to a threat, teasing, or injury, students should TALK—USE YOUR WORDS, GET HELP FROM TEACHERS.
